## **Membership Rules**

The four classes of membership are:-

### (a) Honorary Member

Members attaining 50 years continuous membership of the Club are entitled to apply for honorary life membership. Honorary life membership status may also be conferred by the directors to reward loyal service. Certain officers may also have honorary status for the period of their tenure. Honorary memberships must be endorsed by the members in general meeting. Honorary members shall not be entitled to vote on matters regarding subscriptions but shall otherwise have the same rights as full members.

(b) Senior Member

Members shall achieve senior status if they have reached 65 years of age by the start of the year's fishing season and also have completed seven years of continuous membership. Senior members shall have the same rights as full members.

(c) Full Member

Full members must be over 18 years of age as of the 15<sup>th</sup> March in any given year.

(d) Junior Member

Junior members must be under 18 years of age on the 15<sup>th</sup> March in any given year but over 12 years of age. A junior member shall pay adult subscriptions forthwith upon reaching the age of 18 years. Junior members shall not be entitled to vote or attend general meetings of the Club.

## **Termination of membership**

A member may withdraw from membership by giving 7 days' notice.

Membership is not transferable.

A person's membership terminates when that person dies or ceases to exist.

## Subscription

The annual subscription payable by Association members shall be such sum as the members shall determine from time to time at the AGM. It shall be payable on election to membership and thereafter annually on or before 31<sup>st</sup> March. If the subscription has not been paid by that date the defaulter shall, subject to subsequent decision of the committee, immediately cease to be a member.

Any subscription unpaid by the above date shall be deemed to be a debt to the Treasurer of the Association.
